Alternatively, about half of our graduates choose to take advantage of our articulation agreements with several 4-year universities and go on to complete their baccalaureate degree in one of several related fields. Because students have completed the first two years of their studies at WCCC and because of our articulation agreements with other institutions, students can complete their undergraduate degree in four or five semesters. This option allows students to acquire their bachelor's degree for far less money than they would have if they had studied all four years at university. In addition, students end up with much more field experience and a handful of certifications that make them much more employable.
