The Associate in Applied Science is a two-year program that prepares students for entry level careers in human services or to continue their education in the human services/behavioral sciences field. The program will provide opportunities for personal and professional growth through applied and classroom instruction, community involvement, and practical experience under direct supervision of professionals in local agencies. Upon completion of the program, graduates are eligible for their Mental Health Rehabilitation Technician Certificate (MHRT/Community) and to apply for Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor (CADC) certification testing eligibility
