
PROGRAM **DESCRIPTION**

The Associate in Applied Science eighteen-month Nursing degree program allows students to enjoy small class sizes, supportive faculty, transferable courses and leadership/engagement opportunities all at a very low cost. Courses are offered on the WCCC Campus in Calais, as well as clinical rotations located throughout the State of Maine. Students who successfully graduate from the program become eligible to apply to take the NCLEX-RN licensing exam; successful completion enables the graduate to seek licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN).

Enrolling in our Health Occupations Certificate Program will allow you to complete required general education and pre-requisite courses needed to seek admission into the WCCC Nursing program!

PROGRAM **OUTCOMES**
