Liberal Studies - Associate in Arts

The Liberal Studies program is desiged to provide a foundation of study that prepares students to transfer to four-year colleges or universities.

The curriculum is built on a foundation of general education and electives to develop depth in the background knowledge required for further study. In some cases where an Associates Degree is an employer's defined miniumum credential, the degree serves as a terminal degree for employment.

The program includes a minumum of 60 credits of course work with 31 credits omprising a required core of courses and 29 of the credits comprmising selected electives transferable to the students desired baccalaureate program of study.

Employment and occupational outlook studies continue to show the value of postsecondary education to a person's career opportunities and earning potential. Many employers look upon the Associate Degree as a minimum requirement for skilled occupations. In addition, the Associate Degree can serve as a platform of accomplishment for pursuing additional education and career goals.

Upon completion of the Associate in Arts Degree in Liberal Studies, the graduate is prepared to:

- Demonstrate knowledge in wirting, speaking, science, mathmatices, compute rliteract, the humanities, critical thinking, problem solving, and human-relations in both the professioanl and personal sphere.
- Transfer credit earned through completion of the program to a baccalaureate program at a four-year institution.
- Pursue technical programs that meet his/her abilities, needs and desires.
- Demonstrate critical thinking skills that enhance eomployment opportunities and earning potential.
- Enter the workforce, as many employers look upon the Associates Degree as the minimum requirement for skilled occupations.
